Community Dinner

BE OUR GUEST! On the 3rd Tuesday of each month anyone in Ware can be our guest for a hot meal. At noon, Trinity volunteers will serve a hot lunch at the Hillside Village location to those in line for the Western Mass Food Bank delivery. Then at 6 PM on the same third Tuesday, all are invited to come for a hot meal at Trinity's Morrill Hall. We welcome veterans and all who are hungry or in need of a warm meal.

Mobile Food Pantry

The Western Mass Food Bank in conjunction with the Bay State Mary Lane Community Benefits Advisory Committee and Stop & Shop's Our Family Foundation delivers a truck full of free fresh and non-perishable groceries directly to a community site for immediate distribution to residents. The program reaches underserved populations throughout Western Massachusetts that don't have access to healthy foods, including families, seniors and children.

There are no eligibility requirements to receive food from our Mobile Food Pantry. Anyone in need of assistance can attend. It's a good idea to arrive 10-15 minutes prior to distribution time, and bring with you boxes or bags to carry your food.

Every third Tuesday of the month rain or shine.

The event takes place in the parking lot at Hillside Village 17 Convent Hill Road Ware, MA.

Van Policy Changes

The Ware Council of Aging and the Staff of the Ware Senior Center want make you aware of the Van Services that are available to you. This includes service for shopping and medical visits. **COA Van Services** normally operate from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm Monday, Thursday & Friday. Destinations are limited to within the Town of Ware. The Suggested Donation is \$1.00 per trip. Lift service is available. Ask the Van Coordinator for policies for van use. For further information or to schedule a ride please contact the Van Coordinator at 413 967 9645.

COA Van Policies

All rides must be scheduled **48 hours** in advance
Patrons are limited to two stops per day (example:
after pick up, a ride to Big Y followed by a ride
to CVS; or a ride to one business and then the
Senior Center then a return home)

In cases of inclement weather, for safety reasons, the Van may only operate for medical appointments (blood tests, Dr.'s appointment and counseling) No shopping. Determination on van use on such days will rest with the Senior Center Director after consultation with Van Coordinator and driver scheduled that day

Medical appointments take priority over all other trips

Patrons must designate a specific pick up and drop off time when making the appointment Drivers will not go in to stores to shop for patrons Patrons are limited to what they can carry on and off the Van in one trip or they may request assistance. Riders needing assistance must request such assistance when making your ride appointment. Drivers are only allowed to assist with up to 3 standard sized bags with a combined weight not exceeding 25 lbs. Patrons are responsible for any extra bags etc.

Patrons requiring use of lift must do so in advance.

The lift may be used by anyone. The patrons need for assistance or use of lift will be added to patron information with the permission of the patron.

Policy Effective April 3, 2017.

Alternative Transportation Options

If you are planning on visiting the Senior Center and you live in Valley View Apartments, Highland/Hillside Apartments, or Ware Brook Village, the **PVTA Shuttle** now makes regular, daily, scheduled stops in the Ware Senior Centers' parking lot allowing you to get to and from the Senior Center. The shuttle schedule now allows riders to participate in afternoon activities. Schedules are available at Front Desk or on the Senior Van.
