Post Tax Season Mass DOR Issues Addressed

To Everyone,

This is an update on some of the post season issues we have heard about.

- 1) Some returns required a negative adjustment to the Circuit Breaker calculation to accommodate a rollover. These were caught by the DOR, but many were held with no notice and no indication to the taxpayer why they weren't getting their refund. If you ran into this situation, the taxpayer needs to contact DOR Customer Service, explain the situation and send (fax) the letter we prepared, this should break the logjam.
- 2) Taxpayers who receive a military pension with state withholding may have their refunds adjusted (Wrongly) by the DOR to remove the MA withholding. There seems to be a glitch in the new MA software (The DOR software not TaxSlayer) which does not recognize withholdings from DFAS pensions (which are not taxable in MA). In previous years, the DOR would send letters asking the taxpayer for proof of the withholding (i.e. a copy of the 1099-R) this year the adjustment seems to be automatic and a letter is sent to the taxpayer saying an error was made in the return. To resolve this, the taxpayer needs to contact DOR Customer Service and send them a cover letter with a copy of the 1099-R to show proof of the withholding.

If you run into these problems or others please let AARP Tax Aide know so we can see how widespread it is.



Autumn is a favorite season for many. Cooler temperatures and leaves changing.

While the changing colors of the trees are pretty to look at, cleaning the piles of fallen leaves sometimes seem like an ongoing chore.

Leaf blowers make the cleanup easier, but you risk exposure to loud sounds. It is best to wear hearing protection while using this equipment. Damage from noise exposure can be gradual.

Signs of hearing loss from noise exposure include distorted or muffled sounds. difficulty understanding speech, and tinnitus.

Consider a hearing screening if you are frequently around noise.
